

BC Attic Insulation Rebate Planning Checklist

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1. Confirm the programme path

- Check whether your home is routed through BC Hydro, FortisBC, Better Homes BC, CleanBC Better Homes Energy Savings Program, or an income-qualified/free-measures programme.
- Do not assume Better Homes BC, CleanBC, BC Hydro, and FortisBC are separate rebates you can stack for one attic job.
- Check whether pre-registration or an eligibility code is needed before work starts.

2. Confirm contractor eligibility

- For standard insulation rebate paths, check whether an HPCN member is required.
- For CleanBC Better Homes Energy Savings Program insulation work, check whether the contractor must be approved as a registered contractor for insulation.
- Do not rely on verbal claims alone if the rebate matters to your budget.

3. Check attic condition before topping up

- Measure the current insulation depth or R-value if possible.
- Look for uneven, compressed, wet, or missing insulation.
- Check for blocked soffit vents or missing baffles.
- Look for moisture, mould, pests, rodents, or vermiculite.

4. Ask for the right invoice details

- Homeowner name and installation address.
- Contractor name and contact details.
- Insulation location, type, square footage, and R-value before/after.
- Paid invoice date and application deadline.

5. Avoid these assumptions

- Do not assume DIY attic insulation qualifies.
- Do not assume the Canada Greener Homes Grant is still open.
- Do not assume a quote reserves rebate money.
- Do not assume every contractor can complete rebate-eligible work.

6. Questions to ask before approving work

- Which rebate path applies to my home?
- Does this path require an HPCN or programme-registered contractor?
- What R-value is being added?
- What will the invoice say?
- Who submits the rebate application?
- What is the deadline?
